


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Richard Hooper VAS2964

I do Hereby Certify that I Knew Richard Hooper as a Lieutenant & Captain in the Revolutionary War with Great Brittan he Entered Into Service in thee year 1776 & Continued upwards of three years in thee 6th Virginia Redgmt on Continental Establishment Given Under my Hand this 18th of Aug't 1811

I do herby Certify that I knew Richard Hooper as a Captain in the Late Revolutionary War with Greate Briton he Entered into Service in the 1776 and Continued threir in the 6 Virginia Redgment in Continental Establishment Given under my hand this 24th day of August 1811

Georgia } Be it known the Obadiah Hooper above subscribed personly apeard befor me
Franklin County } a Justice of the peace for the above County and after being duly sworn as the
law directs [undeciphered word] the above Certificate [the rest illegible]

It does not appear by the books of this Office, that any Land Warrant, or warrants, ever issued, for military services performed by Wm Poyner, Barnabas Arthur, Richard Hooper, William Penticost, or Edward Wills, in the Revolutionary war between the U.S. and G.B.
