Affidavit of James Casey [S9158]

The affiant being duly sworn sayeth, that he is now seventy four years of age, that he was a soldier in the revolution, that he enlisted under Capt. Henry Pitt in the Virginia Continental line, fifteenth regiment in the early part of the war; that the regiment was command by Colonel David Mason [VAS506]; that he served three years in the 15th regiment, and was honorably discharged, and now draws a pension from the United States of eighty dollars per year; that he was well acquainted with John Everitt and Jonakin Aunt and Thomas Whitley, all of the above named soldiers belonged to the 15th Continental Regiment to which I was attached, and we all went on to the north & served three years together except Thomas Whitley who died in service before the three years had expired. The affiant now lives in Isle of Wight County Virginia, wh[ere he] lived before he went into the army. Given under my hand & seal this 26th day of July 1833.
