State of Illinois }
Monroe County }

I, David Nowlin clerk of the Circuit Court of said County, do Certify that it is proven in open court, to the satisfaction of said Court that Peter Laperche, Louis Laperche, Francis Chevalier and Pierre Chretien [Pierre Christian] were Privates in the Revolutionary War, in the Illinois Regiment commanded by Col. George Rogers Clarke [sic: George Rogers Clark VAS269]; that they served between three and four years, when the regiment was discharged, and that they never received a warrant, or warrants, for the Bounty Land promised them, either on the part of the united states or the State of Virginia, nor did they ever transfer their claims to it, or them, in any manner whatsoever. It is further proven that the said Peter Laperche, Louis Laperche, Francis Chevallier and Pierre Chretien died without wills, and that the within named Parties to this instrument are the only Heirs.

Peter Laperche is also mentioned in the application of Pierre Martin VAS2960.

The file contains a power of attorney signed by their marks on 10 Sep 1834 by “Joseph Laperche, Pierre Laperche, Louis Laperche, John B. Laperche, Andrien Laperche and Edward Hebreth and Pauponne Hebreth his Wife, and John Pourselir and Angelique Pourselir his Wife; Heirs at Law of Peter Laperche, their Father, and only Heirs of Louis Laperche, Francis Chevallier and Pierre Chretinn.”
