Virginia documents pertaining to Tully Clark VAS3019

Robert Russell Sr [W5753] who is a man of truth and veracity made oath before me that he served in the 9<sup>th</sup> Va Reg't in the Cont'l line in the Revolutionary War & was captured at Germantown [4 Oct 1777] & was in service including his imprisonment about 3½ years. that he was well acquainted with Tully Clark who served in said Reg't one term & reenlisted for 3 years or for the War & died in service. Witness my hand & seal this 7<sup>th</sup> July 1833

Levin Hyslop [W7858] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he enlisted in Capt Blairs [John Blair VAS2518] Company of the 9<sup>th</sup> Va. Reg't in the Continental line & after serving out one term reenlisted for the War & served till the war ended & has drawn 200 acres of Bounty Land for his services – that he was intimately acquainted with Tully Clark who enlisted at the same time & after serving one term in s'd Reg't reenlisted with the Witness to serve “during the War” & died in service. Witness my hand & seal at Accomack County this 7<sup>th</sup> Feb'y 1833.
