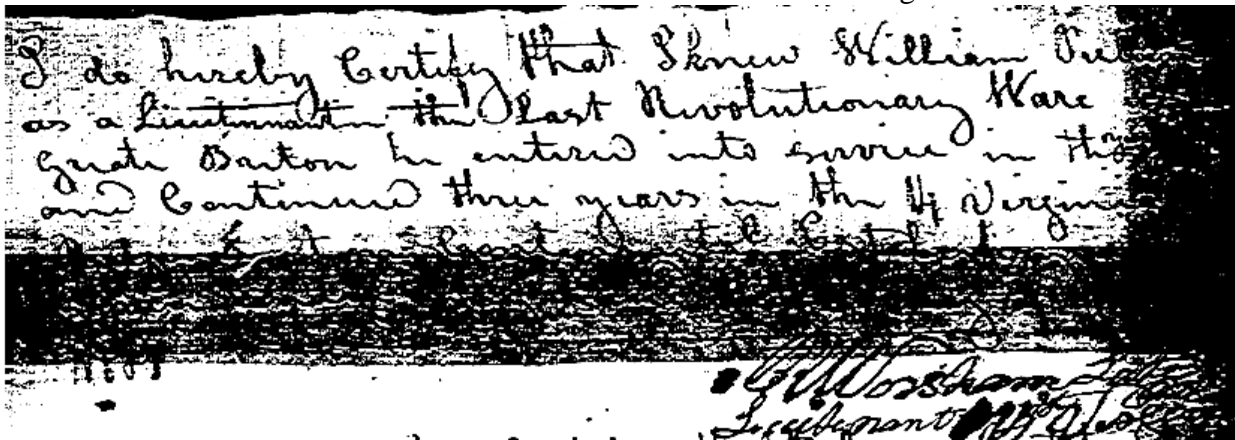

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do hereby Certify that I knew William Pullen as a Lieutenant in the last Revolutionary War with Great Britain he entered into service in the year [illegible] and continued 3 years in the [illegible] Virginia [one or more lines of illegible text]

I do hereby certify that I knew William Pullen as a Soldier & Lieutenant in the late Revolutionary War with Great Britain. He entered into Service sometime in the year 1776 and continued in service upwards of three years in the Virginia Line on Continental Establishment in the 14 Regiment. Given under my hand this 19th of July 1811

Hereby Certify I knew William Pullen as a Lieutenant in the Revolutionary War with Great Britain. He entered into the service sometime in the year 1776 & continued in service three years & 6 months in the 14th Virginia Regiment & on the Continental establishment. Given under my hand this 22nd of August 1811
