Memorandum of Wm. Cole's enlistment [undeciphered word] Inlisted at James [undeciphered] with Capt. Morgan Ale[page torn; Morgan Alexander VAS2203] Feb'y 76[?] and served 3 years [illegible]ard he was Discharged at Middle Brook [Middlebrook NJ] by Maj'r Posey [Thomas Posey BLWt1733-450] he was first in Alexander's Comp'y then Calmes [Marquis Calmes S12674] then Capt Long [Gabriel Long S9166] then Capt Caughlin 11th Reg't Lieut. Barns his officer
Second Inlistment was with Capt. [undeciphered] at Winchester a Light Dragoon Cap'n Jan'y 1st[?] and then serve till I had Leave to list in the Navey then served out his time in the Navey [illegible] discharge Dated Apr'l 5th 178[?]

This certifies that the bearer hereof William Cole a Seaman belonging to this State is discharged from the service by order of the Governor he having behaved himself well during his enlistment
