




Franklin County Virginia August 26 1830

Sir enclosed you will find my application for the Bounty land due me for my services in the Revolutionary war which I have never gotten I wish you to investigate my claim as soon as convenient as an answer will be shortly Requested personally I am yours obediently



State of Virginia/ County of Franklin Sct

I Sterling Cooper of the County and State aforesaid aged seventy years last June do Certify that I enlisted in the year of 1776 - 1777 or 1778 in the County of Lunenburg and State of Virginia. And served to the end of my enlistment and was a Sergeant and do ask the Governor and Council of Virginia to grant me a land warrant for my services in the Virginia Continental establishment in the Revolutionary War.



Virginia. Mecklenburg County to wit:

I certify that Sergeant Sterling Cooper of Lunenburg and now of Franklin County Va. enlisted in the Virginia Continental line for 3 years, in the Company to which I belonged, in the year 1775 or 1776 commanded by Captain James Johnson attached to the 2d Virginia Regiment and Continued during the time of enlistment in service. Given under my hand this 27th of August 1824.
