
The affidavit of Thomas Self [S19461] Taken at Thomas[?] Coxes house in Northumberland County and state of Virginia the 23^d day of February 1832 before William Henderson a Justice of the peace for northumberland County and state of Virginia. the affiant being first Duly sworn according to law deposeth and saith that he knew John Crawley formerly of the County of Northumberland and state of Virginia that he inlisted In the United States Service in the early part of the revolutionary war and died in the Service and further this affiant saith not

The affidavit of Moses Self Sen'r [W19009] taken the 3rd day of March 1832 before me John Darby one of the Commonwealths Justices of the peac for the County aforesaid.

The affiant being first Sworn according to Law deposeth and saith that he knew John Crawley formerly of the County of Northumberland and State afore s'd that he enlisted in the United States Service in the early part of the Revolutionary war and was a Sergeant in Captain Burgess Balls [Burges Ball BLWt252-500] Company and Died in the service and further this Affiant saith not
