



I do hereby certify that John Crew was Enlisted by myself for Two years on the [illegible] Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment and that the said John Crew died in the Service. Given under my hand this 7th day of May 1808

Ordered that it be certified that James Bradley is the only heir at Law to John Crew deceased.

To the Governor and Council of Va.

The Petition of James Bradley of Henrico County heir at law of John Crew deceased a private Soldier of the 6th Virginia Regiment of the army of the Revolution and died in the services of the United States as appears by the Certificate of Lieutenant John Bell an officer of the said Regiment which is herewith enclosed with the other proof in the case, begs leave to represent that he believes the statement above made is strictly correct, and prays that the Register of the Land office may be directed to issue a Warrant for the quantity of acres allowed by law to a private who died in service, and your petitioner as in duty bound will pray &c &c.
