[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]


"a Sergeant in the Militia of the County of Ohio and killed in actual service of the Commonwealth by the Indians, is continued on the list of Pensioners with an allowance of twelve pounds yearly from the first day of January 1786.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 3rd day of October 1789.

Receipt signed by Mary Ogle (using her mark) indicating her receipt of 8 pounds Dec. 23, 1790. In other documents in this file, Mary Ogle is identified as the widow of Jacob Ogle. The receipts continued until the last one dated July 9, 1807 which bears her signature as follows:



. Although there are a large number of documents in this file, they consist of routine annual renewals of the pension and annual powers of attorney or receipts given by the widow.
