Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." These are to certify that Robert Oglesby formerly a Soldier in the 13<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment has Duly and faithfully Served in the term of three years for which he was enlisted in consequence of which and at his own request is hereby Discharged from any further Service in the Army of the United [States] he having received all his Bounty pay and Clothing and Deficiency of pay and clothing in full of all ordinances and provisions made by the Congress for the troops. Hereof Given under my hand at Philadelphia the 14<sup>th</sup> day of February 1780
