I John Slate of Virginia and County of Brunswick do hereby certify that I was in the service with Ensign Thomas Davis in the revolutionary war, we both belonged to the 15th Reg't. on continental establishment commanded by Col David Mason [VAS506]; owing to his bad state of health he was compelled to return home but died on his way home as I have been informed; he had no father living at the time of his death, but had four brothers living viz John, William, Frederick & Jesse & one Sister (Martha) who married John Posser[?], and that the present Thomas Davis now of Greensville County Va. is a son of John Davis. given under my hand this 23rd day of March 1831. I John Goodman Sr. State of Virginia & county of Greensville do hereby certify that I was in the service with Ensign Thomas Davis in the revolutionary war we both belonged to the 15 Reg't. on Continental establishment commanded by Colo. David Mason the said Davis enlisted for three years under Capt. James Mason and joined the grand army under Gen'l. Washington in June 1777. And I believe served his time faithfully.
Given under my hand this 25th day of March 1831.
