[The following printed discharge has illegible hand-written entries transcribed here in italics from a copy misfiled with the federal pension application R2755 of the widow of a different Thomas Davis.]

THIS is to certify that *Thomas Davis a Corporal in the Chasseur* in the First Partisan Legion, under my Command, has served *faithfully, bravely & honestly* to this Day, is hereby discharged from the Service of the United States, in Pursuance of Orders received from the Commander in Chief, bearing Date the third instant.

I farther certify that *Thomas Davis a Corporal in the Chasseur* having been *enlisted in the State of Virginia* is intituled by the Resolution of Congress, of the 13th February, 1779, to the Benefits that have been, or hereafter shall be, granted by the said State to the Noncommissioned Officers and Soldiers of the said Line.

Given under my Hand and Seal at York Town [probably York PA], this *fifteenth* Day of November, 1783.




