

Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to William Dickinson VAS3367

Louisa County to wit

This day, Wm Dickinson personally appeared before me, one of the Commonwealth Justices of the Peace for said County, and made oath, that he went down to the siege of York [Yorktown, 28 Sep 19 Oct 1781] as a Militiaman, & there enlisted in the Va. line, for Continental service, under Leut. Garland Cosby [S30334], for a term, during the Revolutionary War in the year 1781 in the month of September, or October – that he was to have two hundred acres of land & forty dollars bounty & was ordered to keep in readiness at a minute's warning, but was never called for, as the war soon after terminated [sic: formally ended 25 Nov 1783] – Given under my hand this 8th day Oct'r 1831.

This day Thornton Mead [VAS623] personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for the County afores'd & made oath to the facts contained in the above certificate. Given under my this day & date above.
