Authority is given by us the heirs at Law of the late Reuben Doudge to R W Ferish to receive for us and in our name the Land Bounty promised by the State of Virginia for the Services of the said Rouben Doudge in the Virginia State Line during the War of the Revolution and in our name to give a receipt for the same as Witness our hands and seals this 6th day of Feb 1832

Willo Doudge

Reuben B Doudge

Acknowledge before me a Justice of the Peace for the County of Princess Anne and State of Virginia this 6 day of Feb. 1832

Jacob Hunter J.P.

At a Court held for Princess Anne County the 4th day of July 1834. The Court certify that Satisfactory evidence was adduced in Court to prove that Reuben Doudge Sr was a private in Capt. Augustine Tabbs [Augustin Tabb R18331] Company in Col. Dabney's [Charles Dabney R13624] regiment during the war of the revolution and continued in service until the close of the war.
