Prince William County Virginia

On this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April 1833 personally appeared before me the subscriber a justice of the peace for aforesaid County, Hugh Davis [S10136] aged 74 years who being first duly sworn according to Law States on his Oath that he well knew William Dowell as a soldier of the Revolutionary War – that said Dowell enlisted into Captn George McCormicks [George McCarmick S36105] company in the Year 1776 in the Month of March for the term of 3 years, which period he served out with fidelity and acted the part of a brave and faithful soldier. Said Dowell died about the year [blank] leaving no legitimate (if any) issue. His brother Jeremiah Dowell who was his heir at Law died several Years ago leaving several children, who are now the heirs at Law of the aforesaid Wm. Dowell
