Thomas Moore (VAS740) of Harrison County KY, but it is not legible enough for transcription. There is also a document signed on the same day by Thomas Ravenscraft (S1248) of Harrison County that is even less legible.]

State of Kentucky/ Bourbon County Sct [12 Jan 1822]

This day Edward Stoker [W11551] late a private in Capt'n Lemman's [John Lemon] Company in the Thirteenth Virginia Regm't, and afterwards The ninth Virginia Regm't of the Revolutionary army of the Virginia line personally appeared before me Wm. Bowles a Justice of the peace in and for the County of Bourbon aforesaid and made Oath that he was well acquainted with Thomas Dunn a Sergeant in Capt. Thomas Moores Company in said Virginia line in the Revolutionary army and The said Thomas Dunn Served During the war and I believe that he was Honourably Discharg'd at the Close of the War.

Q<sup>st</sup> do you know if Thomas Duss is decease or not, and if Dead When and Where did he Die. Ans'r he Died in Bourbon County and state of Kentucky and he Dec'd some time in the year 1817 or 1818 and further saith not
