[The following are from [bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia](#) in two files assumed to pertain to the same officer.]

I do certify that I saw William Fowler acting as first Lieutenant in Captain Faulkner's [sic: William Fowler VAS3627] Company of the fifth Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment in the month of March, one thousand seven hundred and seventy six, and was thereafter promoted to the Rank of Captain. Given under my hand this 1st[?] May 1807.

I do hereby certify that William Fowler entered the Service of the United States as Lieutenant in the fifth Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment, in the month of February one thousand seven hundred and seventy six, and was afterw[ard] promoted to the Rank of Captain. Given under my hand this 30 May 1807.
