Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Jacob Nay VAS364

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]



State of Virginia Harrison County

We Israel Thompson and Lucretia Thompson, late Lucretia Nay, Charles McIntire and Lucinda McIntire, late Lucinda Nay and Martin Nay, heirs at law of Jacob Nay deceased do testify and declare to the best of our knowledge and belief that Jacob Nay was drafted, for the term of eighteen months, at Culpepper Courthouse in the year 1780 in the Regiment under the command of Colonel John Guen [?]¹ of the Virginia line, at the expiration of which time, he enlisted for the term of during the war, in the Virginia Regiment was marched to the South, served in __ Milands [perhaps an erroneous attempt to identify Colonel Stephen Moylan's] troop of light horse in Georgia and South Carolina and continued in the service aforesaid until the close of the war, for which he received a certificate for bounty land from the United States.


We further declare that we have never received a warrant for the Bounty land promised to Jacob Nay on the part of the State of Virginia, nor do we believe that he ever received it, or transferred his claim to it in any manner whatsoever; therefore

Know all men by these presents, that we Israel Thompson, Lucretia Thompson, Charles McIntire, Lucinda McIntire and Martin Nay aforesaid, do hereby constitute and appoint Joseph Johnson to be our true and lawful attorney for us and in our name to demand and receive from the Register of the Land Office at Richmond Virginia a warrant for the quantity of land due to us as aforesaid; and I'll attorney is hereby fully authorized and empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes or attorneys under him, for the special purposes above expressed.
