
Kentucky Cumberland County Sct.

On this day John Fudge of said County aged about Seventy years, appeared before me the undersigned being a Justice of the peace in and for said County who made oath that he the said Fudge Served as a private soldier in the Virginia State line in the Revolutionary War with Great Britain for three years. Thus he served under Captain Thomas Smith and Colonel Samuel Lewis & [several undeciphered words] That at the time he entered the service he resided in Augusta County Virginia, that he was discharged just a few days before Cornwallis defeat or Surrender [Yorktown, 19 Oct 1781].

Sworn to and Subscribed before me

this 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1830

This day Came before me the undersigned a Justice of the peace in & for Cumberland County Kentucky James Saufly & John H Walthall & Willson Bowman[?] Resident Citizens of said County, who are respectable disinterested & honest men who made oath that the aforesaid John Fudge is a man of veracity, upon whose statement on oath the strictest reliance may be placed.
