I do hereby certify [that Jona]than Grady a private in the 14th Virg'a Reg't inlisted the 1st day of January 1777 and serv'd his time faithfully untill the 20th day of Jan'y 1780 the term of time he was enlisted for

State of Virginia to wit

This day Hampton White a Credible Man of Pittsylvania County in the state aforesaid personally appeared before me the undersigned a Justice of the Peace in and for the County of Pittsylvania and State aforesaid and made Oath that he was a Regular Soldier in the War of the Revolution & Served three years in the [several undeciphered words] and well remembers that Jonathan Grady was also a Regular Soldier that Served in the said Regiment at least three years and that he left him is Service near Philadelphia in the month of January 1780
