This is to Certify that Carter Hamlett a [several undeciphered words] untill the First Day of March Then he
Join the head Quarters at Rich'd [undeciphered] Brunswick

Robt. Lyell Capt [Robert Lyell]
18 Feb'y 1777

Carter Hamlet A Private Soldier in the third Regiment having Served his full Time of Inlistment is
therefore Discharg'd from the said Service & Recommended to the notice of Evry Good Person as one
that has Ever behaved himself as a good & [illegible] Soldier Given under my hand at Haddrals Point [see
endnote] this 20th Day of Feb'y [illegible year]

Wm Henderson [William Henderson R14952]
[undeciphered] 9th Regoment

In Lunenburg County Court 9th February 1815

Ordered that it be certified that it appears to the satisfaction of this court, that Carter Hamlett was a soldier
in the revolutionary war & that he served the full period of his inlistment which was three years and
further that he was honorable discharged. a Copy teste Will. H Taylor

NOTE:

“Haddrals Point” may refer to Haddrell’s Point near Charleston SC.

In [rejected claims in the Library of Virginia](#) there is a letter by Edmund F. Taylor of Lunenburg
County stating that in the fall of 1816 Carter Hamlett gave him his discharge and other papers, which
Taylor subsequently lost.
