Much Respected Sir

I wrote to Col. Allison [probably John Allison W4112] some time ago respecting the Money that is due to me by the publick, and likewise the deficiencies of cloathing. he informs me that I must apply to the Auditors in Richmand, or if I had an opportunity of sending to you, he did not doubt but you wou'd inform me how to act.

As my present circumstance will not admit of my going so great a distance, I take the Liberty of requesting you, to inform Cap'tn. T. McIlhany, who is so kind as to carry the papers in order to get them settled, and make no doubt if seems convenient to assist him, the business will be much better settled than if I were present.
