


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to John Hays VAS3821

John Hays Soldier in the first Virginia Reg't having served the United States from the 14[?] of Feb'y 1778 to this date and being inlisted for the War is hereby Discharged the American Army Given at Point Fork [Point of Fork] the 13th of September 1783.

To his Excellency the Gov. of Virginia [Stafford County, 21 July 1835]

Your Memorialist Alfred C. Hayes being the only heir of John Hays who was a soldier in the Virg'a Contn'l line in the war of the Revolution respectfully represents, that he has been informed by his Father the said John Hayes that he entered the service as a regular soldier of Infantry & frequently heard him talk of the different arduous duties he had to perform and many hardships he had to encounter, but your Memorialist does not know what regiment he belonged to. Your Memorialist therefore prays that his claim for Virg'a bounty land for the services of said John Hays may be refered for examination and that the same may be allowed and he will &c.
