Kentucky Fayette County (to wit)

Daniel Hukill appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County & made Oath that he Enlisted in the year 1780 for during the war in the Company commanded by Capt Edward Spencer of the Third Virginia Regiment Commanded by Col. Parker On the Continental lin and that he continued to serve in said corps until the close of the war in the year 1783 at which time he was honorably discharged – and that through the course of time he has lost his discharge. Kentucky Fayette County Sct. [15 May 1822]

Joseph Franklin [possibly W10041] appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he was well acquainted with the [undeciphered] Daniel Hukill [part missing at bottom of page] said Hukill while he belonged to the Regular Army and knows that he Enlisted for during the war in the year 1780 and did serve until the close of said war about the year 1783 and was then honorably discharged, as he has stated in his affidavit within
