Frankfort Ky Feby 15 1839

Dear Sir I enclose to you the Petition of Archibald Johnson Esqr praying an allowance of an additional quantity of Bounty Land

I was informed by my Brother Wm H Todd that your Excellency had granted an additional quantity to the heirs of Officers who were killed or died in the service

The one here presented being of the class of claims

Please examine the same and inform me at the above place

I am Respectfully your obt Humble Svt/ Sam'l. Todd

Hon'l. [Gov.] David Campbell/ Richmond Va

NOTE: The file contains a letter to the Governor of Virginia from Henry Bohannon of Laputa in Shelby County KY dated 3 Feb 1840, which reads in part: "Near to my house lives an old man by the name of Archibald Johnson, of whom I wrote to you last fall. He is entitled to some Bounty lands in right of Col. George Johnson Dec'd a Revolutionary officer. This old gentleman A. Johnson employed (as I wrote to you before) Sam'l. Todd of Frankfort to obtain his lands, and as he has had no information on the subject what has become of his case, he wishes to hear as he is now very old, & wishes if he obtains anything to dispose of it himself."
