[several illegible words] that in the year [illegible] to serve for three years in Capt Ashby's Company [John Ashby VAS2301 company raised in Fauquier County] of the [illegible] Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment commanded by Col. James Wood [BLWt2419-500] and that he continued to serve in said corps until the said term of enlistment had expired at which time he was honorably discharged and that he has never rec'd his Land bounty for said service, and that he prays it may now be granted to him.
