Treasury Department/ 3^d Auditors Office/ 18th August 1835

Sir [John P. Duval Esq'r, Bardstown Kentucky The Power of Attorney to you from Mr. Abraham Kellar who appears to be the Administrator of Isaac is herewith returned and in reply to your inquiry, whether said Isaac Kellar has received his commutation, I have to state that the revolutionary records, on file in this Office, furnish no evidence of his having been an officer in the Virginia line, and of course, it does not appear that he has received, or, that he was entitled to commutation.

The evidence of Administration &c is also herewith returned.

[Writing from the other side of the page has bleed through the paper, making the following difficult to decipher.]

The Memorial of the heir of Isaac Kellar to the Executive of Virg'a. [3 Sep 1835]

Your memorialist Abraham Kellar of the County of Jefferson Kentucky [undeciphered word] and only heir of Isaac Kellar a Sergeant in the Illinois Reg't, respectfully represents to the Executive of Va that he has been informed and believes that his father the said Isaac Kellar enlisted at an early period in the Illinois Regiment, under the command of Col George R Clarke [sic: George Rogers Clark VAS269], but at what time and under what Captain of the said Reg't your memorialist does not know but has been informed that he served in the same Reg't until the close of the war as Sergeant. Your Memorialist therefore respectfully requests the Executive of Va to direct the Register of the Land office of Va to issue to his Attorney in fact John P. DuVal of Bardstown Ky or to his Agent Att'y Gen'l Wm Lambert of Rich[mon]d Va warrants for the quantity of land due me as heir of the said Sergeant Isaac Kellar of the Illinois Reg't for his services for three years or during the war of the revolution.
