


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to William King VAS3925

The affidavit of Hartwell Savedge [S7452] of the County of Surry in Virginia taken at the House of Jesse King in the said county the 28th day of May 1834. The affiant being duly sworn saith that he was well acquainted with William King of the said county prior to, and during the Revolutionary War, and knows that in the year 1776 the said William King enlisted in the company of state line troops on continental establishment which was raised and commanded by Captain John Watkins [VAS3230] and went on the said company to the north and was attached to the fourth Virginia Regiment, and while in the service as this affiant understood & believes he died: he never did return to Surry, nor has this affiant ever heard that he was not ded – the time for which he enlisted was three years.
