Kentucky Fayette County Sct

James Lee appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he Enlisted in the month of June in the year 1777 for three years in the Company commanded by Capt Jones [Strother Jones BLWt2442-300] in the 16<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment Commanded by Col. Gist [Nathaniel Gist BLWt1874-500] on the continental line and that he continued to serve in said corps until the month of Sept or Oct 1780 At which time he was honorably discharged in Richmond Va after performing a tour of upwards of Three years and that through the course of time he has lost his discharge and has never rec'd his Land Warrant.

Kentucky Fayette County Sct [7 Sep 1821]

William Anderson made Oath before me A Justice of the Peace for said County that he served Seven years in the Virginia Continental service and was personally acquainted with the above named James Lee and knows and believes that said Lee Enlisted for three years in the 16<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment and served to the end of said period and was honorably discharged as is stated in his affidavit within and that this the same James Lee to the best of his knowledge and belief.



Kentucky Fayette County Sct. [7 March 1822]

John Carpenter [S35812] appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he served in the same Regiment and was well acquainted with the above named James Lee in the Revolutionary War and knows that said Lee Enlisted for Three years and served Out his time as he has stated in his affidavit within
