

Helebrant Lozier [W16331 of the City and State of New York being duly sworn according to Law deposeth & saith, that George Painter entered the Service of the United States in the year seventeen hundred and seventy nine, as a Sergeant of Dragoons in the Legion Commanded by Lt. Colo Henry Lee and continued to serve as such in s'd Legion until the conclusion of the revolutionary war.

Sworn this 14<sup>th</sup> day of Sept'r 1819

Be it known, That on this twentieth Day of September one thousand eight hundred and nineteen Before me, Nicholas Diehl, junior, Notary Public for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by lawful authority duly commissioned and sworn, residing in the City of Philadelphia, in the said Commonwealth, and by law authorized to administer Oaths and Affirmations, personally appeared James Cooper at present of the City of Philadelphia State of Pennsylvania who being Sworn according to law, on his solemn Oath did declare and say, that George Painter entered the Service of the United States in the year seventeen hundred & seventy seven and was a Sergeant of Dragoons in the Legion commanded by Lt. Colo. Henry Lee, continued as such in said Legion, until the Conclusion of the Revolutionary War.
