John Nelson [S35537] late a Capt. in the 5<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment on Continental line Appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he was well acquainted with William Parker a private soldier who enlisted for the War in the Virginia Continental Army in the 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> Va Reg't in Capt. Stubblefield's Company and that said Parker served out the term for which he enlisted, and was discharged and that said Parker departed this life about Twenty years ago

State of Kentucky, Fayette County Sct: August Court 1822.

On the motion of Henry Asbury, who made it appear to the satisfaction of the Court by the oath of John Nelson, that William Parker now a soldier, in the Revolutionary War in Virginia, about Twenty years ago [sic], and that he died, leaving Benjamin W. Parker, Beverly Parker and Catherine Parker, his children, and only heirs at Law; It is ordered that the same be certified &c.
