I do Certify that Sej't William Parrish Served five years in the Sixth & Second Virg'a Cont'l Reg'ts and is intitled to the allowance of Land allowed by an act of Assembly

I John Bell hereby certify that I enlisted William Parrish for two years and at the expiration of the two years again enlisted him for three years making in all five years in the sixth Virginia Regiment of Continental establishment. Given under my hand the 16th June 1808

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 12th day of April 1783, in the name of William Parish as a Sergt of Infty for £112.2.0, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to himself and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.
