

Abijah Parsons is Intitled to a Discharge the 4<sup>th</sup> of April 1783 provided he served his Tour faithfully & agreeable to Articles of War. Given under my Hand 27<sup>th</sup> August 1782

[undeciphered signature] Lt 1<sup>st</sup>

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the eighteenth day of December 1783, in the name of Abijah Parsons as a soldier of infantry for £59.11.6, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Z. Johnson, and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.

Given under my hand at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 28<sup>th</sup> day of February 1833.

Advised to be rejected – there being no proof of length of service.

1850 Sept. 18 Rejected

NOTE: A letter dated 16 Dec 1850 refers to “Abijah Parsons, who is the son and only heir of Abijah Parsons dec'd who was a soldier in the revolutionary war.”
