

Mr Thos Pears went in the Army in the month of Jan'y or Feby 1776. I Left the army the 29th Jany 1779 & Left him there when I Came away & be leave he inlisted again after his term for the two years expired
John Royster [VAS3809]
[undeciphered] 1811

I do hereby Certify that Thomas Pears enlisted into the Continental Army under Captain John Pleasants of Henrico County in the Month of Jan'y or Feb'y in the year one Thousand Seven hundred & Seventy Six for the term of two years. That he served in the said Army until the two years expired. Given
[undeciphered] this 15th Nov'r 1811. John Royster

I do hereby Certify that I was acquainted with the above [undeciphered] Thos Pears in the army of the U. States, & that he was in the Army at the close[?] of the War & was discharged with the Other troops, at the Point of Fork. This 12th Dec'r 1811 William Price
