I do hereby certify that David Pew enlisted to serve in the continental army during the War some time in the Spring of 1777 and that he died in the service in the month of December 1778 Certified under my Hand this 8th Day of March 1784
Isaiah Marks [R16055]
Capt 7th Virg'a Reg't

At a Court held for Loudoun County March 8th 1784
Ordered that it be Certified to the Auditors of Public accounts that it was proved to this Court that James Brown jun'r is Heir at Law to David Pew who died in the continental Service

March 9th 1784

Sir, Be pleased to send pr the bearer a Certificate of my right to land for Services perform'd in the Continental Army & oblige
To His Excell'y the Governor
