


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

I Certify that James Peyton Inlisted in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virg<sup>a</sup> Regiiment the 10<sup>th</sup> of Oct'r 1776 for the term of three years & Continued in Service till the 1<sup>st</sup> of Jan'y 1780  
Given under my hand at Winchester Barracks May 14<sup>th</sup> 1783

Mercer County [undeciphered] State of Kentucky  
I Thomas Jones [S36656] a revolutionary soldier in the 10<sup>th</sup> Regt of the Virginia line on Continental Establishment do hereby state on Oath that I well knew James Peyton who lived in Casey County Kentucky & that the s'd Peyton served in the Revolutionary War as a Regular Soldier for three years in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regt of the continental line we served under the same Capt viz Capt Shelton [Clough Shelton BLWt740-300] of Col Stephenson's [sic: Edward Stevens VAS1922] Regiment that s'd Peyton served out his time and was honorably discharged and we were promised 1 hundred acres of land and the s'd Peyton was discharged at Morris Town [Morristown] in the State of New Jersey  
Given under my hand this 20 day of Sept 1823. Thomas his Xmark Jones

Casey County } October Court 1823.

Satisfactory proof being made to the Court by two good & Credible Witnesses that Lewis Peyton, Washington Peyton; Salley McGalied[?] late Sally Peyton; William Peyton. James Peyton, Zelsry Peyton[?] & Elizabeth Peyton, are the true heirs & Legal representatives of James Peyton deceased all of which is Ordered to be certify A Copy Teste Joel Sweeney CCC
