I, Mary Jarvis now about seventy one years of age, do hereby certify that I was personally acquainted with William Pryor a Soldier in the Revolutionary war, and that I believe the said Wm. Pryor served in the Revolutionary war as a soldier at least three years, if not longer, and I further certify that I believe the said William Pryor served to the end of the Revolutionary war. Given under my hand & seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of Dec'r in the year 1833.

The heirs of William Pryor, a soldier of the revolution, pray an allowance of land bounty for his services. They file the certificate of Mary Jarvis, an old lady in Portsmouth, proving said Pryor's revolutionary services.
