


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to John Reynolds VAS4199  
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

I Gabriel Hughes [W19836] of the County of Mathews and State of Virginia, do hereby certify and declare, that I was well acquainted with John Reynolds formerly of that part of Gloucester County called Kingston Parish, and constituting Mathews County. The said John Reynolds did enlist in the Virginia State line, in the year seven [sic] hundred and seventy six or seventeen hundred and seventy seven as a soldier, but do not recollect who he enlisted under, but I recollect well he marched from the County, and did not return until the end of the War. And I always understood and believed that he continued in said line until the end of the war. As witness my hand and seal this 18 day of March 1834

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 22nd day of October 1783, in the name of John Reynolds as a Soldier of Infantry for £57.2.8, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Armistead Plumer and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.

Given under my hand at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 20th day of March 1834.
