Kentucky Fayette County Sct.

James Richards Came before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he enlisted in the year 1776 for during the war in Capt. Doyls Company of Col. Daniel Morgans Rifle Regiment of the Virginia Continental line in the year 1776 and that he continued in Service until the end of the war in the year 1783 At which time he was honorably discharged in the City of Philadelphia by Capt Smith and that he served his Country faithfully and was taken prisoner at Quebeck [Quebec, 1 Jan 1776] under General [Richard] Montgomery and he served in said [undeciphered word] as a Sergeant and was discharged as such and he has lost his discharge, and he has never rec'd his Land bounty

James Lee [VAS3944] appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he was in the same Regiment with the within named James Richards in in the Revolutionary War and knows that said Richards enlisted for the war in the year 1776 or 1777 and did remain in Service until the close of the war in 1782 or 1783 when said Richards was honorably discharged as a Sergeant, and said Richards served his Country faithfully
