At a Court held for King and Queen County at the Courthouse on Monday the 14<sup>th</sup> of October 1811

Conquest Royston made oath that John Ripley served in the 2<sup>d</sup> Virginia State Regiment three years as a Sergeant that after that period he inlisted during the war and that in the year 1781 he saw the said John Ripley in the army at York Town in Virginia acting as a Sergeant and that he was living a few days past. Copied at the request of Dawson Cooke, 8<sup>th</sup> June 1813

Teste Ro. Pollard C.C.

Mathews County to Wit,

This day personally appear'd before me, one of the Common Wealths Justices for the afores'd County John Ripley; and declared that he served dureing the Revolutionary War with Great Britain in the Continental Service, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia Regiment Commaned by a Colo. Brent [William Brent VAS2639], under whom he served three years; the Ramainder to the end of the War, he served to the southard &c; as a Sargeunt agreeable to the within Statement on Oath of Conquest Royston, at the Court of King and Queen County, (which was taken at the s'd Ripley's request) and the within Cobby made at the instance of Dawson Cooke; of the s'd County of King & Queen; who was, and is hereby appointed by the s'd Ripley to present his case to the Executive, and to obtain from them, a grant for any Millitary Lands which may be due for his said services. Given under my hand this 2<sup>nd</sup> of December 1813. Robert Hunley
