THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof Joseph Robinett Private Soldier in the Invalid regiment, having faithfully served the United States seven years and six Months and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 11<sup>th</sup> day of September 1783

By order of the secretary at war, B Lincoln [Benjamin Lincoln]

Jos. Carleton [Joseph Carleton] Sec'y

Registered in the books of the regiment, Jon'tn Pugh [Jonathan Pugh] adjutant.

War office, September 11<sup>th</sup> 1783.

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.
