State of Virginia, County of Nansemond to Wit:

This day James Coleburn Sr. appeared before me, Ro. H. Webb, a justice of the peace for said County, and made oath that he was well acquainted with, one James Rodgers, of the County of Accomack State of Virginia, and that he the said James Rodgers enlisted in the State service, for three years, in the early part of the revolutionary War, and he the said James Coleburn verily believes, that he the said James Rodgers remained the three years & longer.

He also says that the said Rodgers returned after the war was over, for he was well acquainted with him & was with him often times. Given under my hand & seal this 13th day of Feby 1833.

[The following probably pertains to James Rodgers (Rogers) VAS2107.]

The name of James Rodgers is upon the roll in the Auditor's Office as having drawn his certificate for balance of pay. It also appears upon record in the Auditor's Office that James Rodgers was a state pensioner from 1785 to 1788 – his name cannot be traced after that date. Rich D. Webb
