


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we James A. Ellis & Patsey Ellis his wife in right of the said Patsey as heir at Law to Samuel Roundtree deceased of the county of Franklin and state of Kentucky, do hereby constitute and appoint Nathaniel Sawyer of Frankfort in the county of Franklin and state aforesaid, to be our true and lawful attorney [the rest not transcribed]
[7 Oct 1818] [signed] James A Ellis Patsey Ellis

I Lewis Powers [S36740] of the County of Franklin & State of Kentucky, do on oath declare that I was a Corporal in Capt. Bland's [Theodorick Bland VAS1859] Troop of Light Dragoons in the first Virginia Regiment of Light Dragoons in the Continental establishment in the Revolutionary War – that I knew in service Samuel Roundtree mentioned in the aforesaid Power of Attorney – that said Roundtree enlisted to serve three years in Capt. Woodson Company in Col. Woodfins[?] Regiment belonging to the said Continental Line, that he served out the said three years & was honorably discharged from the service – that said Roundtree died four or five years since & that the Patsey Ellis mentioned in the aforesaid Power of Attorney is the Daughter of the said Roundtree & one of his heirs at Law.
