I Certify that I was well acquainted with John Sadler who enlisted under Capt'n Charles Tomkies [W6304] Commanded by Col Dangerfield [sic: William Daingerfield] in the revolutionary war as a private and that he was killed at the Battle of Brandy Wine [Brandywine, 11 Sep 1777] As Witness my hand and seal this 14th day of May 1832 John Morgan [S5777]



Mathews County to Wit

this day John Morgan appeared before me a Justice of the peace for the aforesaid County and made oath to the truth of the above statement given under my hand and seal this 14th day of May 1832

I John Morgan of the County of Mathews and state of virginia do upon oath that [several undeciphered words] that I was well acquainted with John Sadler of Gloscester [sic: Gloucester] County That part Called kingston parish now Constituing mathews County That the said John Sadler did inlist in the war of the revolutionary in 1776 of the Continental line under cpt Charls Tomkies and marched to the north in the state of pennsylvania and in Engagement was killed at the Battle of Brandywince Henry young [Henry Young BLW2466-300] command the company when Sadler was killed Sadler was a private and belong to the same Copany that I did
as witness my hand and seal the the 5 day of march in the year of 1834
