THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof George Salmon, a Serjeant in the first Virginia regiment, having faithfully served the United States from the 15<sup>th</sup> September 1777 & afterwards reinlisted and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.


Given at the war office the 8<sup>th</sup> day of August 1783.

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.
