I William Cannon [VAS2879] of the County of Princess Anne and State of Virginia and formerly a Soldier of the Revolution in Capt. A Tabbs [Augustine Tabb R18331] Company, Dabneys [Charles Dabney R13624] Regiment, Virginia State Line, do hereby certify that Jno Salmons was a Soldier of Infantry in the said Line during the war of the Revolution and was in Service during the whole of the War. Given under my hand this 16th day of January 1832.



Personally appeared before me Jonathan Hunter a Justice of the Peace for the County of Princess Anne Thomas Bonney [S6688] of the said County who made Oath that John Salmon was a Soldier in the Virginia State Line during the War of the Revolution and was in Service 3 years and was honourable discharged, and I Certify that Thomas Bonney is worthy of Credit. Given under my hand this 6th day of Feb'y 1832

It appears on reference to "A list of soldiers of the Virginia line on Continental establishment who have received Certificates for the balance of their full pay agreeable to an act of assembly passed November Session 1780" filed in this department, that certificates issued, on the 17 June 1783 in the name of John Carroll [VAS2905] sol inf for £63.9.0 on the 14 June 1783 in the name of John Henley [VAS1493] sol inf for £15.0.0 on the 9th October 1783 in the name of John Salmons sol inf for £18.10.7 – and on a similar list of State soldiers &c &c that a certificate issued to Thomas Isdoll [Thomas Isdall VAS1351] sol inf'y on the 13th September 1783 for £55.19.1.
