I do Certify that Thomas Sanders was a soldier in Colo Blands [Theodrick Bland VAS1859]regment off
Dragoons in 1778 at which term I comanded a Troop in Colo. Moylands [sic: Stephen Moylan] Regement
of Dragoons I am satisfyed that Sanders was Inlisted for the term of three years and sseved his time out
faithfully

Dear Sir Washington Nov. 13, 1820

I am requested to present the enclosed affidavit again to the Council. The "Thomas Saunders" of
whom the Witness speaks is certainly now living and if any evidence of that kind would avail anything, I
can give testimoney of that fact myself, as I know both the Witness and Tho. Saunders. George Gray was
a Captain in Bland's or Temples regiment of horse and the records in Richmond would no doubt show his
services. You will oblige me by presenting it to the Council and advising me of the result. And if there
exists still any difficulty on the subject, of what nature it is.
