I do certify that George Scott enlisted a Soldier the six Virginia Regiment the first day of August for the term of three years which time he has faithfully served.

NOTE: At the time Capt. Gillison wrote the certificate, Haddrell Point on the east side of Cooper River was a camp for American officers captured at the surrender of Charleston SC on 12 May 1780. Soon afterward the prisoners were sent to Jamestown VA for exchange.
