



I do hereby Certify that James Scott Senior served as first lieutenant under my command in the thirteenth Virginia Regiment for three years in the revolutionary War Given under my hand this 19<sup>th</sup> Day March 1806  
David Scott [S25425]  
Captain [Captain] in the 13<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment



I Certify that the above named James Scott served as an Lieutenant in the 13<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment for some time but being Called to serve in a distant quarter from where he served, I do not recollect at what time he left service.

I David Scott Son of James Scott Senior late a Lieutenant, in the thirteenth Virginia Regiment and Brother to John Scott deceased, do hereby appoint and authorize, Colo David Scott, to receive the Land warrants which I am entitled to as their Representative for their Bounty & Donation. In Witness my hand & seal this 19<sup>th</sup> day of April 1806

[several undeciphered words] before me a Justice of the peace for said County That Lewis Scott (son of James Scott, who was a Lieutenant in the 1<sup>st</sup> Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment) is the eldest son of the said James Scott [undeciphered] who was living previous to the first day of January 1787 his son John Scott having died when in actual service, given under my hand this 19<sup>th</sup> day of April 1806.
